We had second row center seats, which we got in June '97, a full four months before the show opened...and we still had to wait for over a year to see it! The Lion King has the most creative staging we have ever seen. It was a pure joy watching the wonder on Jared's and David's (and Debbie's) faces. Over this holiday season, I am taking Debbie to NYC for a night to see "The Blue Room" starring Nicole Kidman.

The market in the display industry is rapidly changing. There used to be a handful of players manufacturing and selling "high-end" video projectors, and only two of those (including Hughes-JVC) sold the high-bright models. There are now more than twice as many players as just a year ago, with at least five that directly compete with us. The change is in what used to be considered the low-end

which now have improved LCD products that have virtually replaced CRT projectors which were the standard in board and conference rooms. The bottom line is that glory days are over for the prestige manufacturers including Hughes-JVC... As projectors become more and more of a commodity, we must change to survive. 1999 is going to be challenging for all of us in the industry.

I also am in my 6th year at producing the computer software for the InfoComm Projection Shoot-Out, which is the premier display event in the display industry.
